The Keeping Ourselves Safe programme is currently being taught through all levels of the school. A range of ways to keep safe are being explored from using correct language for body parts in the juniors to some very robust discussions about cyber safety in the senior classes. Constable Carl, our Police Education Officer, will be at school during next week to teach a lesson from the programme to each class.

The ASB Education Facilitator has been working in classes to deliver a financial literacy programme with the aim of developing cash-clever kiwis from an early age. Catalogues have been sent home with your chidren, or you can collect a copy from the office or library.



On Wednesday 23rd October Room 11 went to the Chelsea sugar factory to learn how sugar is made.

We were split into two even groups, the Pink Group and the Orange Group. I was in a group with a lot of my friends, (I got lucky.) While we were on the bus we were bubbling with excitement, (possibly, because we wanted to see the smoke from the conference centre.) Once we



arrived it started to rain, and when we got off the bus it was chaos because no one wanted to get their "pretty" clothes wet... but the boys didn't care. When the adults found the way into the factory, we put our bags in these smart cubby seats. The supervisor then told us the schedule of the day, so first the orange group would eat morning tea while the pink group would go to the interactive zone for half an hour and then swap.

Morning tea was nothing special, but the big bomb was the interactive zone where we saw history about the factory and played a virtual baking game. After that was done, the orange group did some cookie baking while the other group was doing the factory tour. When we got in the baking room a lady told us to wash our hands. Then she told us how to bake... but she knew that we knew how to bake, so basically it was just safety rules and measurements. When we finished mixing everything together, we rolled the dough into balls, then one of the adults put them in the ovens. Then we rushed to do our dishes so we could decorate our boxes to put the cookies in. (the cookies were the best!)

When the hour was over we switched to the factory tour and we put on a pink helmet and a neon pink vest. There were 5 stations, first was the raw station where the raw sugar is dumped into a room the size of 3 rugby fields! Next was the sugar cleaning place where the raw sugar is cleaned. Next we went to a place with photos of the old factory. After that we went to a place where the raw sugar is mixed with boiling water to make sugar. Did you know that different types of sugar take different amounts of time to crystallise? Finally we went to a packing place were we got to try different syrups (some tasted nice, others not so much.) After all of that we headed back to school telling our friends in the other group what we did. Overall, it was an amazing and we learnt so many new things about the history of the Chelsea sugar factory and how sugar was made!


KAREKARE JUNIOR SURF INFORMATION 2019-20 SEASON


